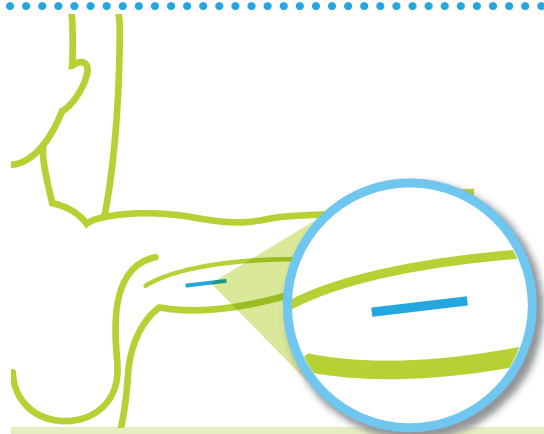
Long Acting Reversible Contraceptives (LARC) are not suitable for some women.

Then why don't you consider Long Acting Reversible Contraceptive methods (LARC)

THERE ARE FOUR DIFFERENT TYPES OF LARC...

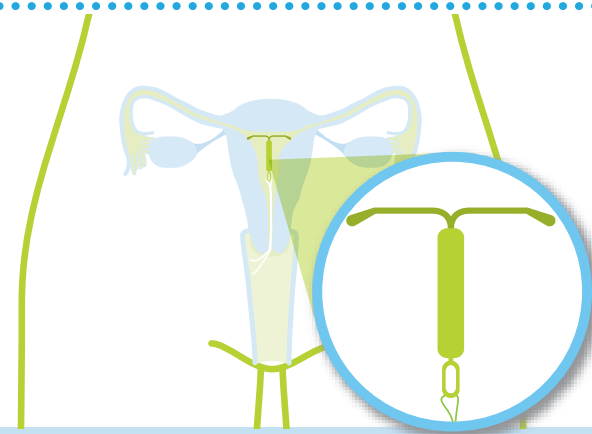


CONTRACEPTIVE IMPLANT

Fitted just under the skin in the upper arm - lasts for up to 3 years

- Contains a hormone called progestogen

over **99%*** effective

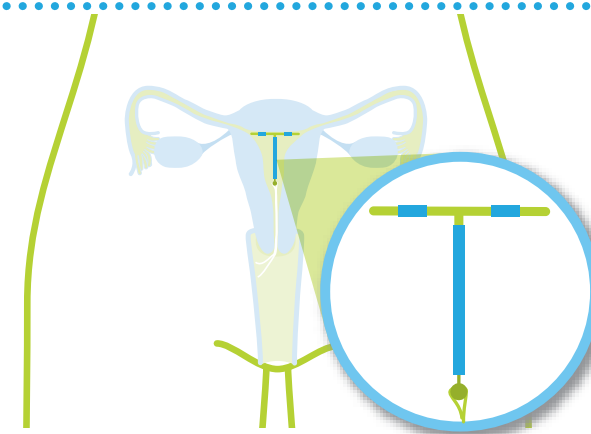


IUS (Intrauterine system)

Fitted into the womb - lasts for 3 or 5 years depending on the type

- Contains a hormone called progestogen

over **99%*** effective

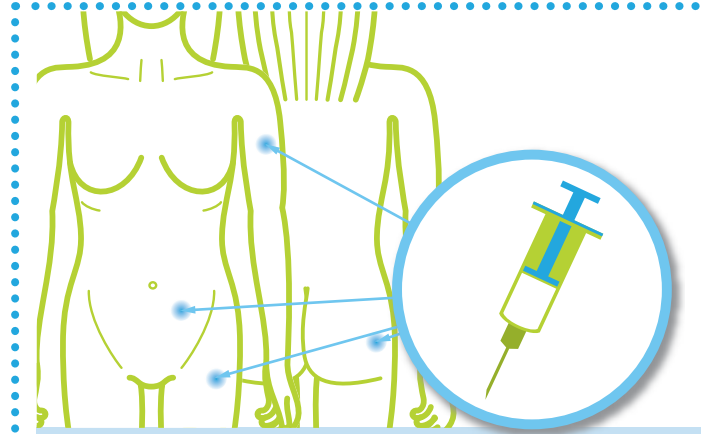


IUD OR COIL (Intrauterine device)

Fitted into the womb - lasts for 5 or 10 years depending on the type

- Does not contain any hormones

over **99%*** effective



CONTRACEPTIVE INJECTION

Injected into the buttocks, arm, leg or abdomen every 8 to 13 weeks, depending on the type

- Contains a hormone called progestogen

94%* effective

These methods (implant, IUS, IUD or Coil) have to be fitted by a trained healthcare professional

LARCs do not protect against sexually transmitted infections. Condoms when used correctly and consistently can help protect against many of these infections. Your doctor or nurse can give you more information about this.
